

Clergy Corner



A kindergarten teacher was telling her students the story of Jesus. In her class was a little boy who came from a non-Christian family. He was paying very close attention to the story because it was all new to him. As the teacher told how Jesus was condemned and nailed to the cross to die, the boy's countenance fell and he murmured, "No! That's too bad!" The teacher then went on to tell how on the third day Jesus

rose from the dead and came back to life. The boy's eyes lit up with delight and he exclaimed, "Totally awesome!" On Good Friday we heard the story of the suffering and death of Jesus. Like the little boy many of us felt like "No! That's too bad!" During Easter we hear the rest of the story and again with the little boy we can now exclaim "Yes! Totally awesome!" We again sing "Halleluiah" that we have not sung all through Lent. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad (Psalm 118:24).

Why do we rejoice today? We rejoice because our faith in Christ has been vindicated, truth has triumphed over falsity. justice over injustice and tragedy has turned into comedy. It is good news to know that truth is immortal. We can suppress Truth, accuse it of being a lie, condemn it, torture it, kill it, bury it in the grave but on the third day Truth will rise again. Remember this and do not give up on Truth even when everybody seems to give up on it. Do not give up on Truth; do not give up on Justice. Do not give up on doing what is right. Truth will always be truth. The Church asks us today to rejoice and be glad. Even when we are going through very difficult times: through betrayal, unjust discrimination, lies, misrepresentations; even when the enemy seems to be winning the battle in our lives. Today Christ has won. And we know that in Christ we shall overcome. Halleluiah, Praise the Lord!

In June of 2022, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops kicked off a 3-year grassroots National Eucharistic Revival. 
Our challenge to you is to take 30 minutes today after Mass to review the reflection and respond to the questions and/or discuss them with your family.


We hope you'll use these handouts to deepen your faith during this Easter season and all year long!


