Clergy Corner

Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,



We are looking forward to the 75th Anniversary of the dedication of St. Mary's church on the 19th of this month and the 91st Annual Parish Festival on the 20th. I request your valuable prayers for the success of the celebrations. Of course success depends on the number of

attendants, so be sure to attend and encourage your friends and relatives to as well! The landscape project will be done by the middle of August, just in time for the Festival.

The common theme of this weekend's readings is the metamorphosis or transformation of Christ by the empowering of God the Father. The First Reading, taken from the Book of Daniel, spreads out before us Daniel's vision of God's glorious Heavenly Court of Judgment. The Transfiguration is a prefiguring of Christ's glorification by God the Father in the Court of Heaven after Jesus' Ascension into Heaven.

In the Second Reading, St. Peter argues that the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ and the testimony of the Old Testament prophets are the guarantee of the doctrine of Christ's Second Coming.

The primary purpose of Jesus' Transfiguration was to allow Jesus to consult his Heavenly Father in order to ascertain His plan for His Son's suffering, death and resurrection. The secondary aim was to make his chosen disciples aware of Jesus' Divine glory, so that they might discard their worldly ambitions and dreams of a conquering political Messiah and be strengthened in their time of trial. On the mountain, Jesus is identified by the Heavenly Voice as the Son of God. The Gospel gives us a glimpse of the Heavenly glory awaiting those who do God's will by putting their trust in Him.
