This is the 4th Sunday of Advent. Today, we are standing right at the front door of Christmas and just before we enter, our liturgy presents Mary to us, to be our model. In following her example, we are called to faith & holiness, humility simplicity, & obedience & surrendering to the will of God,

as we await the coming of our Savior into the world.

Clergy Corner

Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,

As we all know tomorrow we are celebrating Christmas. Why do we celebrate Christmas with great rejoicing? First, Christmas is the Feast of God's sending us a Savior. God undertook the incarnation of Jesus as God-Man to save us from the bondage of sin, and its purpose is given in John 3:16: "God so loved the world that He sent His only Son so that every one who believes in Him may not die, but have eternal life."

Second, Christmas is the Feast of God's sharing His love with us: Jesus, as our Savior, brought the "Good News" that our God is loving and merciful, not cruel or punishing. All his miracles were signs of this Divine Love. Each Christmas reminds us that sharing love with others is our Christian duty, and every time we do that, Jesus is reborn in our lives.

Third, Christmas is the Feast of the Emmanuel (God is with us): we see in the New Testament that God continues to live with us. As Emmanuel, Jesus lives in the Sacraments, in Scripture, in the praying community. Christmas reminds us that we are bearers of God with the missionary duty of conveying Jesus to those around us by loving them as Jesus did, through sacrificial, humble and committed service. Sharing with others is the best Christmas gift we can give, or receive on this Christmas day.

We wish you all the peace and joy of Christmas.
