Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,

Greetings to each one of you. Last week we had to close the parish office due to the construction going on. We apologize if this caused any inconvenience. The project is expected to be finished by the end of this month, with plenty

of time before the Festival. As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, we are still in need of volunteers to help with the Festival. Please try to sign up soon and pray for the success of the event.

Last Thursday was the Feast of St. Alphonsa, the first saint from India. I wish you a happy feast and let us ask for her intercession in our life.

This weekend's readings teach us that faith in Jesus, and sacrificing everything in life to do the will of God are equivalent to possessing the most valuable treasure. In other words, keeping a personal relationship with Jesus, remaining in a state of grace, and sharing his view of life are the most beautiful and precious things in the world.

The First Reading tells us how the young King Solomon opted for the great treasure of accepting God to rule his life by doing His will. That is why he requested of God the gift of prudence. In the Second Reading, Paul teaches that "all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose." And in the Gospel, using three mini parables and one concluding simile, Jesus teaches us that God's Kingdom is something of extraordinary value, like a hidden treasure or a costly pearl. Possessing that treasure demands from us a total commitment if we are to preserve it. The Kingdom of God is God's reign in our hearts. in our lives, in our homes, in our society, and in our world.
