## **Clergy Corner**



This weekend we are celebrating the feast of the Precious Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi. The most precious gift that Jesus Christ gave to the Church is the gift of his own body and blood. Jesus invites us to the banquet. "Do this in remembrance of me ...." This is the last thing Jesus asked us to

do before he died. We believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Jesus says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever. My flesh is the true food and my blood is the true drink." What do we learn from the feast of Corpus Christi? I would like to mention three things. First is communication. The Eucharist is the communication between God and people. God sent his only son to us. That is the Holy Eucharist. We use cell phones, computers, televisions for communication. God's medium of communicating with us is Jesus Christ.

Second is Communion. We experience complete communion between God and people in the Holy Eucharist. The communion between the parents and children is very special and effective. Jesus made this communion between God and us by offering his body and blood. During the Holy Communion we become one with Jesus.

Third is the commitment. Jesus committed his life for us. His commitment was not verbal but by offering his own body. His commitment to us was to save us through his death on the cross by offering his body and blood for us. There is no other commitment greater than offering oneself. Let us today ask our Lord Jesus to increase our faith in the Holy Eucharist. Let the Body and Blood of Jesus nourish us every day.

Wish you all a grace-filled feast of Corpus Christi.



# Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained

How do you explain the Real Presence to children?

The first Communion class is filled with excitement to the point of bursting! They are just awestruck by every new thing they learn about Jesus. Their enthusiasm is contagious as they rattle off the names of the things in church, the vessels and vestments used at Mass, and the names of their pastors and priests. Of course, they know Christ can do anything because he's God. He comes to us in holy Communion because he loves us so much that he wants to be with us. And he comes to us in the form of bread and wine. We really receive him in the Eucharist.


Sometimes it is easier to explain this to children than to adults. Their faith and trust in Jesus is not limited by the questions and doubts that often come with the question of how he does it. Rather, they focus on the question "why," and the answer is something they can easily grasp: love. Christ wants to be with us because he loves us. Nothing is purer in truth or in faith. Not even the theological explanation of transubstantiation, or philosophical reasoning or symbolic references, come close. Christ takes on the form of bread and wine to be simple and approachable, so that no one is afraid or turned away. His love for us is complete and total. We try to love him the same way in return. For a child, it is simple. For us adults, we keep trying. "Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3). ©LPi




## Saint of the Week
