## Clergy Corner



In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. Jesus called the twelve out of all his disciples. We believe that today the discipleship continues in the Church through priestly ministry. We hear much now about the priestly role of everyone who is baptized and that is good, but also

God calls priests ordained in the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the ministerial priesthood, to serve the priesthood of the faithful, all the baptized. Jesus commissions the twelve disciples to proclaim 'the kingdom of God is at hand'. He also commissions them to cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, etc. Everyone through the sacrament of baptism is called to proclaim the kingdom of God. The twelve disciples whom Jesus called are the apostles.

The word apostle means "one who is sent." They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed. As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too we are sent by Jesus. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission. As God was making the covenant with Moses he promised: "you shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation." (Ex 19:6) In some way, all Israelites were to be priestly.

In the first letter of Peter 2:9 we read: "you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. Today in the modern world we continue doing the work that Jesus has begun.

Let us pray for a deeper awareness of our mission to reach out to everyone and ask that the Holy Spirit will give us the vision to see how we could become hands, feet, eyes, tongue and ears to others. Let our wings get strength through the sacraments to fly to every part of the world to be Jesus' ambassadors.

## Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained

### Why do Catholics genuflect?

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means “to bend the knee.” For many Catholics, it’s an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting is an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of “bending the knee” is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians, who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist.


Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel that we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.

In addition to genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament, we are also instructed to genuflect before the cross used for veneration on Good Friday (during the solemn celebrations of the Lord’s Passion) and any time a relic of the True Cross is displayed for veneration. This long-standing tradition is a way of honoring the cross as the great sign of our salvation and of showing devotion to the passion of Jesus. ©LPi
