Clergy Corner



My dear friends in Christ, the readings this Sunday invite us to proclaim our faith courageously. In today's Gospel passage we read Jesus' instruction to preach courageously, live simply and expect opposition and rejection. Three times they are urged, "Do not be afraid!" They are asked to proclaim the Gospel boldly.

Jesus gives three reasons why his apostles, and we, should not be afraid. The first reason is that opponents will not be able to prevent them from their mission because God will be with them. I remember the life of a nun, Sister Rani Maria, a Franciscan missionary who was working in North Indian Missions. She was rendering selfless service for the upliftment of the poor villagers. She was educating them and making them aware of their freedom and privileges. The rich landlords turned against her. She became the object of their hatred, and they decided to get rid of her. On February 25, 1995, on her way to Indore on a bus she was brutally murdered in the daylight. She had 40 major injuries. Unto the last she kept on saying "Jesus! Jesus!" She was beatified on November 4, 2017. She had freedom to protect her life but she decided to fight for the freedom and privileges of the poor. She was not afraid to die for them.

The second reason not to be afraid is the limited power of our opponents. They can kill the body, which dies all too soon anyway, but have no power over the soul. Only God has power over eternity. The third reason we should not be afraid is God's compassionate love. God cares about our smallest problems; even the hairs on our heads are counted.

We may not have a chance to become martyrs but we can preach our faith courageously. Do we have the courage to call our children or grandchildren and ask them if they went to church on Sunday? Do we have the courage to ask them when they are involved in immoral activities? When we see bad behavior in our neighbors we should be courageous enough to stop them.

Therefore my dear friends, no matter what happens to us we should fearlessly preach our faith. Even if we become alone or die, God will be with us. He will empower us and give us courage.

will be held in Giovanni Hall.



Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained

What are the "fruits" of Holy Communion?


The Eucharist, like all sacraments, offers its own unique grace. We receive a special share in God's life that helps us in our faith journey. We are given all we need to sustain and nurture our relationship with God. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Everything we are and everything we hope to become is found in this sacrament. It is essential to the life of the church, to each member of the church. Without it, there is no church. The Eucharist is the center of our spiritual life and has enormous effects on our growth, our holiness, and our way of life. The fruits of holy Communion are the benefits one receives from the sacrament. These fruits of holy Communion are discussed in the catechism in the article on the Eucharist. The primary benefit is union with Christ. We become one with him sacramentally, just as we hope to become one with him for eternity. The Eucharist also separates us from sin, both past and future. It forgives the venial sins of the past and, by the love we receive, protects us from mortal sin in the future. The church community is also unified and strengthened by the Eucharist. It unites us to the poor and offers the pledge of eternal life. ©LPi




Saint of the Week
