



- 3. What is the significance of placing the prayers for all members of the Church (living and dead), the Lord's Prayer and the sign of peace after the Consecration?
- 4. How does our offering of the Body and Blood of Christ on the altar very quickly come back to us? How is it enlarged and expanded as it returns to us?
- 5. Do you have any doubts or questions on transubstantiation? If so, write them down and bring them to a priest for discussion.


