

Clergy Corner



In the Diocese of Sacramento, on this 7th Sunday of Easter, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord.

The First Reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, presents the scene of Jesus' Ascension, the promise of the Holy Spirit, Jesus' instructions

to the apostles to wait in Jerusalem for the power from above, and the missionary command to the apostles to bear witness to him.

Today's Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 47) suggests that, by his Ascension, the risen Lord "mounts his throne" in glory.

In the Second Reading, Paul teaches us that God revealed His might in the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ and that we should exalt Him over all angelic forces. Jesus remains accessible to us now in the life-giving Holy Spirit, assuring us that one day we, too, will be ascending to Heavenly glory, provided that, with His grace, we live out our Faith in Him through the mission of loving service He entrusts to us.

Today's Gospel tells us that, with his return to the Father, Jesus completes his mission on earth. But just before his ascension, Jesus entrusted to the disciples the mission of preaching the Good News and evangelizing the whole world by bearing witness to Him through their lives. It is in his Ascension that we see Jesus entering fully into the life and glory of God. In the descriptions of Christ after his Resurrection, we are given a hint of what life will be like in Heaven. The prospect of sharing that glory should be the driving force of our lives.

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained


Why do Catholics pray to Mary and the Saints?

One of the statements of faith we make when we pray the Nicene Creed and the Apostles Creed is that we believe in "the communion of saints." The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that this communion (another word for community) includes all the faithful on earth, the souls in Purgatory, and the blessed women, men, and children who are in heaven. This teaching is grounded in our belief that, through Baptism, we are united with Christ and to one another with bonds that are stronger even than death. And so from the time of the early Church, Christians have turned to other believers for prayers and assistance, including those who have gone before us, confident that God hears the prayers of all of His children. While we ask the saints for prayers and support, we remember that they join us in prayer, but it is God who blesses and sanctifies us.

We can turn to Mary and the saints for intercession and assistance because they were limited human beings, just like us. They are able to understand our struggles, doubts, fears, joys, and hopes. But as we learn their stories, we can also begin to recognize that they stand out in the history of the Church because they persevered in their commitment to follow Christ. Whether they were ordained, vowed religious, martyrs, husbands, wives, or even children, they show us that holiness is possible. We can not only follow their example but also benefit from their prayerful support.

Our devotion to the saints and gratitude for their witness, prayers, and protection should also be an inspiration for us, especially when we become aware of the needs of others or when others ask us to pray for them. This is also part of our own journey of growing in holiness. ©*LPi*
