The central theme of this weekend's readings is a strong invitation and challenge to render humble, selfless, diligent, committed, loving service to others in the community without expecting honor or rewards in return.

In the First Reading, the prophet Malachi condemns the irresponsible, proud, lazy priests of his day.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul presents himself as an ideal example of servant leadership in a serving Christian community.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus offers a word of judgement against contemporary religious leaders who are more concerned about self-promotion than service to others. Christ-like leadership calls for integrity and honesty from all those in authority, whether priests, parents, teachers or politicians. There should be no double standards in leaders. Rather, there should grow a deep sense of equality with and mutual respect between leaders and those they rule. Each should seek to serve the other. Service, not status, is the mark of this new community, and true humility is the only position its members should seek.
