

# **Clergy Corner**

Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,



October is known as the month of the Holy Rosary. We celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This feast is also called "Our Lady of Victory," this feast commemorates the Battle of Lepanto, but more of that later. The Gospel for this Feast is the First Mystery of the

Holy Rosary, the Annunciation. This Mystery annunces and contains all the other 19 Mysteries within it, and indeed, stands at the center of our creed, which stands at the center of our Mass.

This week on the 4th, we also celebrate the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. St. Francis, born in the 12th century, is a timeless symbol of humility, compassion and love for all of creation. His life was a testament to the power of simple living and profound faith. Francis, the son of a wealthy merchant, chose a path of radical devotion to God and the poor. He famously renounced his material possessions, embracing a life of poverty to better serve humanity and the natural world. His message reminds us that true wealth lies in the richness of our hearts, not in worldly possessions. I wish you all a happy Feast!

The readings for this weekend focus on staying on the path of discipleship. When we sin, we need to turn back to God. He will show us the way. It requires a humble heart to admit we have sinned and seek to get back on the right path. Christ is our model of obedience and humility. The parable of two sons highlights the theme of obedience and response to God's call. The contrast between the two sons' reactions illustrates the importance of genuine actions over empty promises. The parable focus on the son's eventual change highlights the theme of belief leading to transformation. This emphasizes the importance of faith that results in authentic life changes.
