

Clergy Corner

Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,



Greetings to each one of you! Last weekend was the Missionary Cooperative Appeal. You donated over \$2600 to the needs of the Diocese of Bomadi in Nigeria. Thank you for your generous contributions!

Tomorrow is Labor Day and I wish you all a happy holiday!

On 8th September, this Friday, the Church celebrates the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On this Birthday of Our Mother Mary, let us offer her our best gift, by becoming her the prayerful children. I wish you all a very happy feast!

This weekend's readings explain how we should practice true, dynamic, Christian discipleship. Jeremiah, in the First Reading, is certainly a prototype of the suffering Christ.

In the responsorial Psalm, the Psalmist manifests his profound trust in God, just as Jeremiah himself did.

In the Second Reading, Paul advises the Romans - and us- to offer our bodies as a "living sacrifice" to God by explicitly rejecting the ungodly behavior of the world around us and by discerning and doing the Will of God.

In the Gospel, Jesus surprises his disciples when, after Peter's great confession of Faith, Jesus announces that he "must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and on the third day be raised".

After correcting Peter's protest, Jesus announces the 3 conditions of Christian discipleship. "Deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow me".

Once again I wish you all the greetings of Labor Day and the Festal Greetings of the Nativity of Blessed Virgin Mary!




